the use of the space for any number of events including lectures, conferences and performances.

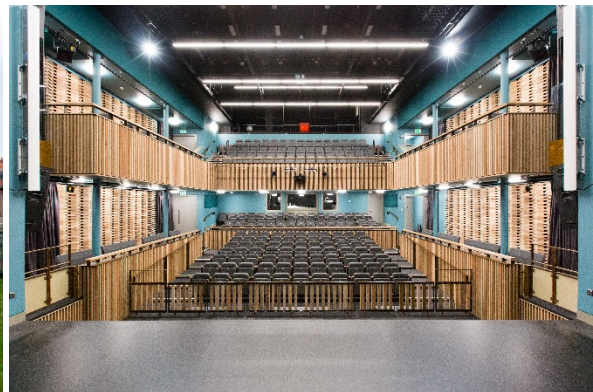
